

Which wood appearance is right for my project?

Premium VDL Laminate

Ideal for Eating Spaces



Pros:

- Cost Effective
- Many color and pattern choices
- Multiple tables will be consistent in color
- Available to re-order to match
- Maintenance free
- Does not fade like real wood
- Limited Lifetime Warranty

Cons:

- Tables longer than 10' will not align or match up at seams.

Butcher Block

Ideal for Creative Learning Spaces



Pros:

- Ideal for Maker Space tables
- Real wood species available (Maple, Ash or Walnut)
- Wood staves that are face glued for incredible strength
- Tops include 12GA solid steel engineered anti-warping braces to help with longevity.

Cons:

- 240% more than VDL
- Maintenance includes sanding down and re-finishing every 2-3 years depending on usage.

Reclaimed Barn Wood

Ideal for Gathering Spaces



Two color choices:

Vermont Medley (Dark)
Prairie Harvest (Light)



Pros:

- Using real barn wood means no two tables will be identical for a one-of-a-kind piece
- Wood characteristics are highlighted including terminate pits, nail holes, knots, natural defects, etc.
- Ideal for gathering spaces where rustic design is desired
- Tops include 12GA solid steel engineered anti-warping braces to help with longevity.

Cons:

- 260% more than VDL
- Maintenance includes sanding down and re-finishing every 2-3 years depending on usage
- Reclaimed wood is likely to warp, split and move over time
- Cannot reorder to match since old barn wood is used, no two tables will ever match.
- Defects in wood are highly likely including terminate pits, nail holes, knots, etc.
